

# Core Online ICS Training



## Ontario Indigenous Cultural Safety Program

The overarching goal of both foundational trainings is to begin an important educational journey that will contribute to improved patient experiences; access to health services and improved health outcomes for Indigenous people.

Both trainings contain the same six Core modules, with the remaining two modules specific to health or mental health.

## Ontario Core ICS Health

Designed for people who work in health and focuses on issues that are specifically relevant for health care professionals working with Indigenous people in Ontario.

Learning is self-paced over an eight-week window and typically takes between eight and sixteen hours to complete, though this could be longer or shorter depending on your style of learning.

## Ontario Core ICS Mental Health


Designed for people working in mental health and substance use services and focuses on issues that are specifically relevant for mental health professionals working with Indigenous people in Ontario. Please note that you do not need to have taken the Core ICS Health to take this course.

Learning is self-paced over an eight-week window and typically takes between nine and seventeen hours to complete, though this could be longer or shorter depending on your style of learning.

### Accreditation

The online Core Health program meets the accreditation criteria of The College of Family Physicians of Canada and has been certified by the College of Family Physicians of Canada for up to 16 Mainpro+ credits. Core Health Training is an accredited Self-Assessment Program eligible for up to 8.0 section 3 credits as defined by the Maintenance of Certification Program of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. Attendance in the Core Health program entitles certified Canadian College of Health Leaders members (CHE/Fellow) up to 4.5 Category II credits towards their maintenance of certification (MOC) requirement.
